NEWS FROM CLINTON COUNTY BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Dear Residents,

If you're completing home remodeling or replacement/upgrade projects for your home, please make sure to obtain necessary permits and inspections from the Clinton County Building Department. This includes required plumbing, mechanical or electrical permits for items such as replacing a water heater, furnace, air conditioning or adding electrical circuits/service upgrades. If you are hiring a contractor to complete this work, make sure they obtain the appropriate permits and inspections. These permits and subsequent inspections are critical to make sure all work meets code requirements for your family's safety and to protect your investment.

Burn Permits

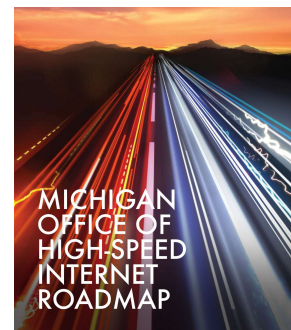

Internet Update

The Michigan Highspeed Internet Office (MIHI) was created to address the unmet need for internet connectivity and manage the distribution of historic federal funding. MIHI is preparing to open up a new \$250 million grant program this winter. Victor Township has partnered with the Clinton County to seek this funding. Clinton County consulted the expertise of Guidehouse to develop and execute a plan that puts us in a strong position. A Broadband Taskforce was recently created to advise the process and includes Victor Township representation. Proposals from Internet Service Provider are currently being evaluated determine the best to partner with for this opportunity. Grant funds will be awarded in 2023. If successful, installation of highspeed internet for all that need it would follow.



Federal Program to reduce the cost of service and connected devices

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program that helps households pay for broadband service and internet connected devices. If your household is eligible, you could receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on internet service
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer
- A low-cost service plan may be fully covered through the ACP

Eligibility is based on household income or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free-Price Lunch. For more information or to see if you qualify visit the website: <https://www.affordableconnectivity.gov/>
